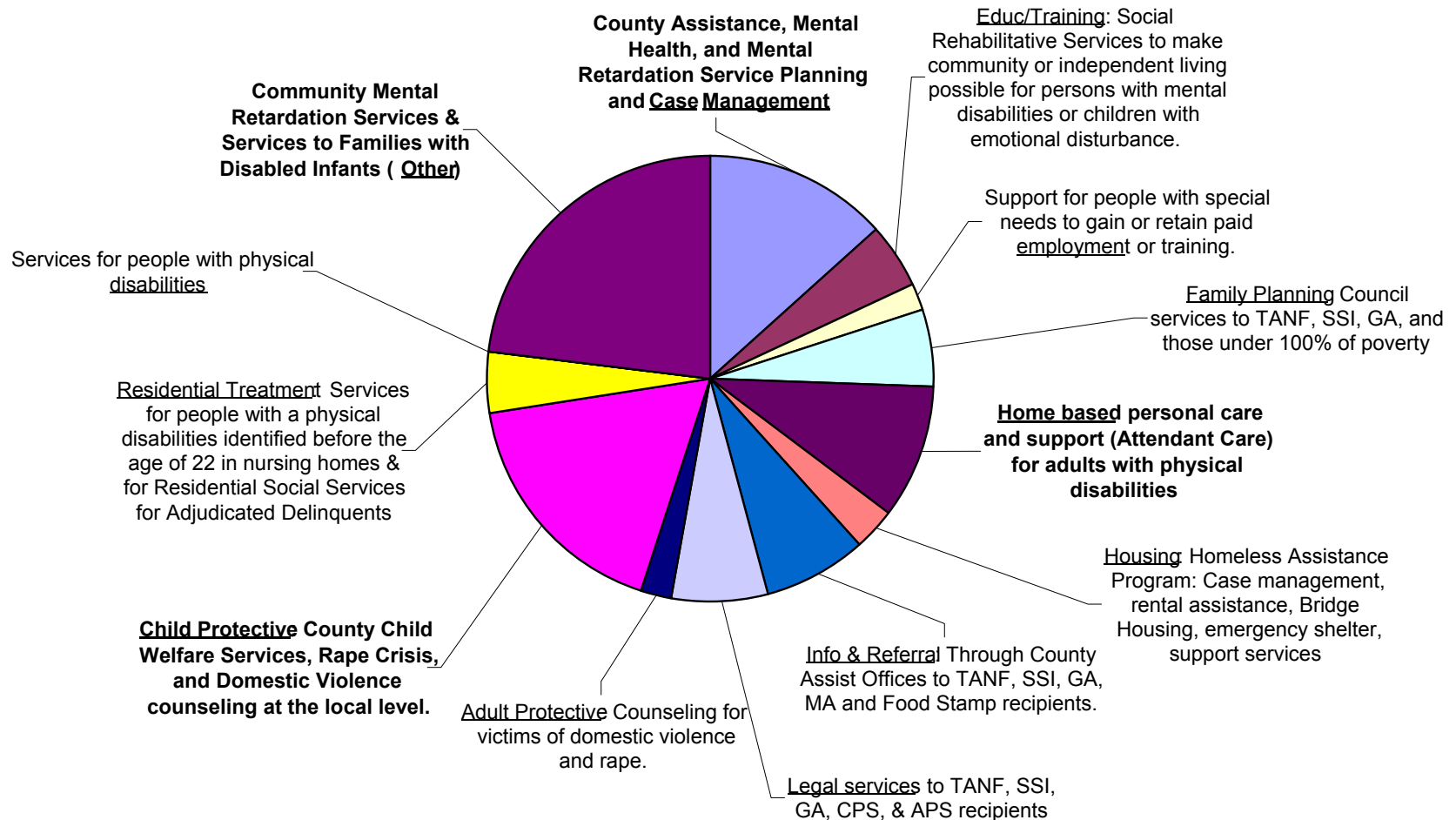

SSBG FY 2004 STATE ALLOCATION: \$73,447,121
TANF TRANSFER: \$30,976,999 for Subsidized Child Care Services
AMOUNT OF PROPOSED 30% REDUCTION TO PA: \$20.8 million/year

TOP 5 SERVICE USES

- **“Other”** defined as Community Mental Retardation Services through county MH/MR programs or private service providers, and Services to Families with Disabled Children who are infant or toddlers under age 2 who have a high probability of being developmental delayed - \$16.2 million
- **Protective Services Children** defined as County Child Welfare Services through County Children and Youth Social Service Agency, Rape Crises, and Domestic Violence Counseling through local provider agencies - \$12.3 million
- **Case Management** defined as County Assistance, Mental Health, and Mental Retardation Service Planning and Case Management - \$9.3 million
- **Home-Based Services** defined as Attendant Care that includes personal care and support to adults with physical disabilities in order to live at home or in the community - \$7 million
- **Information and Referral** provided through County Assistance Office Service Management Program and defined as the direct provision of information about social and other human services and includes assessments of a person’s problem, referral to community resources, and follow-up - \$5.1 million

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS OF KEY MEMBERS

District 3 (Rep. Phil English- Ways and Means Human Resources Subcommittee): The 6 counties (*Armstrong, Butler, Crawford, Erie, Mercer, Warren, Venango*) in the district received a combined \$4.4 million in SSBG funds.

District 4 (Rep. Melissa Hart- Ways and Means Human Resources Subcommittee): The 6 counties (*Allegheny, Beaver, Butler, Lawrence, Mercer, and Westmoreland*) in the district received a combined \$10.76 million in SSBG funds.

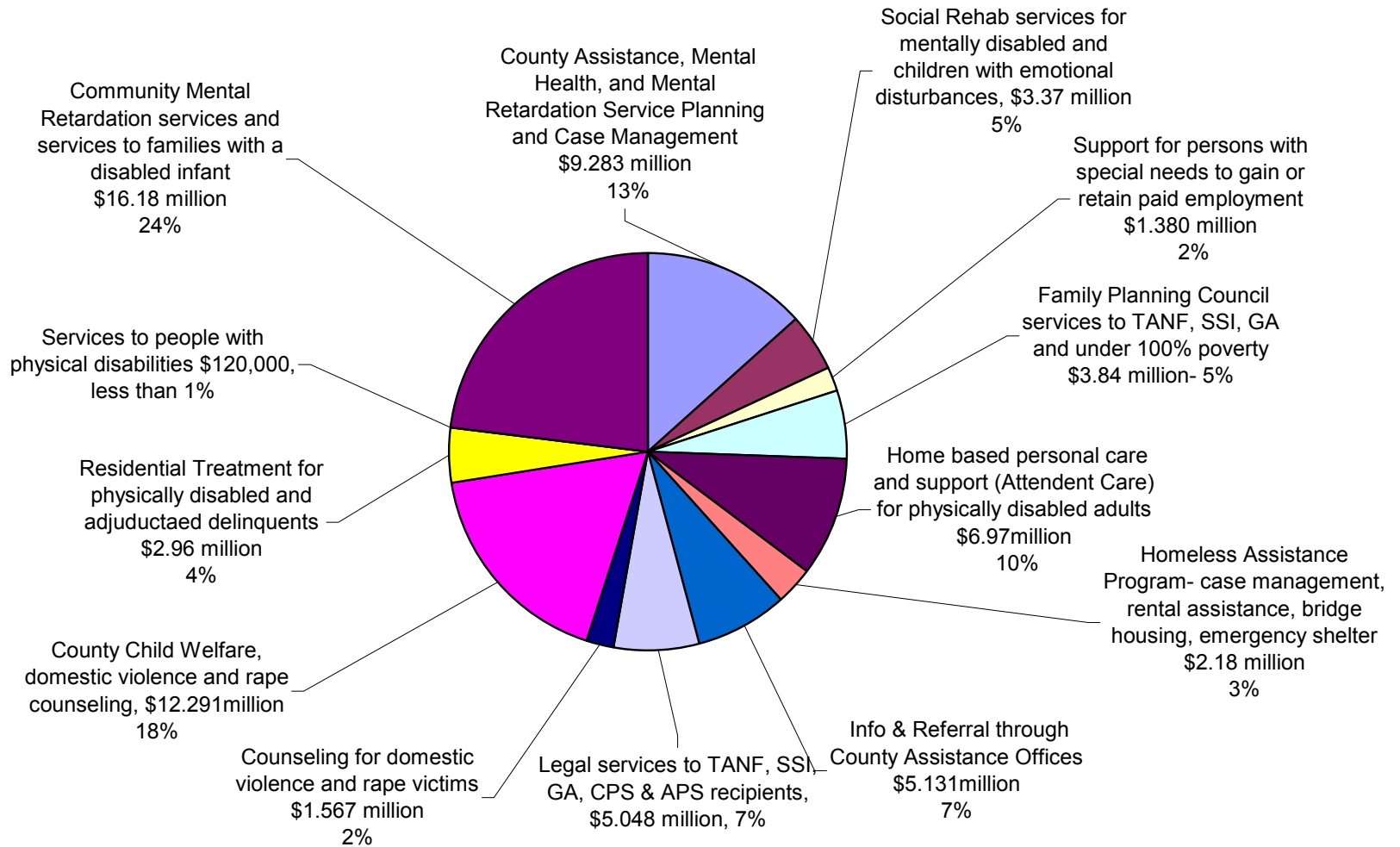
District 5 (Rep. John Peterson- Labor, HHS, and Ed Appropriations Subcommittee): The 16 counties in the district received a combined \$4.16 million in SSBG funds.

District 10 (Rep. Sherwood- Labor, HHS, and Ed Appropriations Subcommittee): The 10 counties entirely in the district received a combined \$2.9 million in SSBG funds and all 13 counties in the district received a combined \$6.39 million.
